

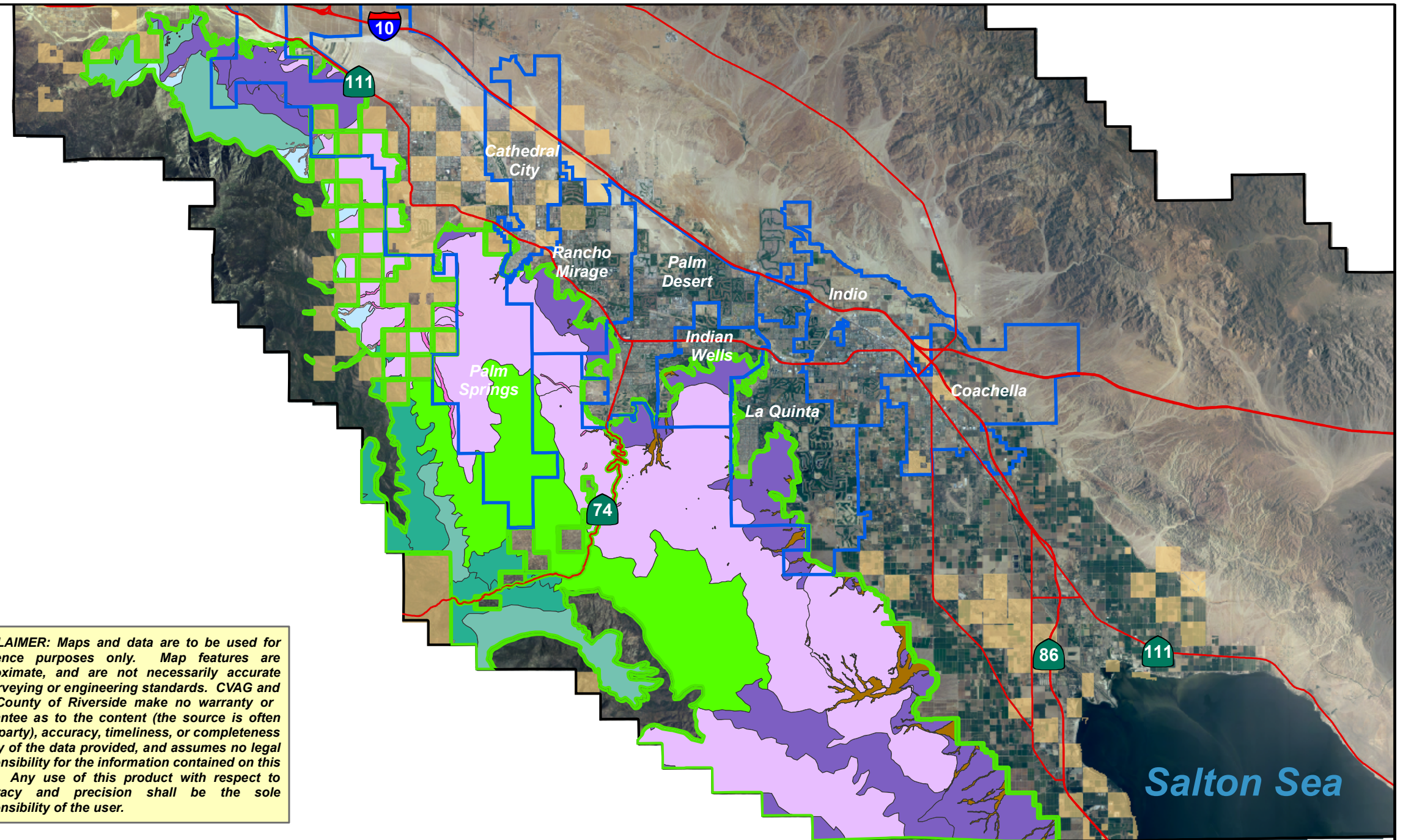

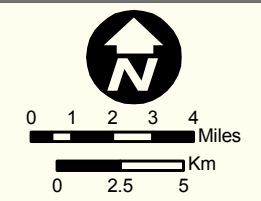


Figure 4-26c: Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains Conservation Area
